F3: PRACTITIONERS ARE RESPONSIVE TO THE FAMILY'S CONCERNS, PRIORITIES, AND CHANGING LIFE CIRCUMSTANCES.





BREAKING IT DOWN

TO PROMOTE OPTIMAL CHILD, PARENT, AND FAMILY OUTCOMES, PRACTITIONERS SHOULD IMPLEMENT FAMILY-CENTERED PRACTICES. THIS INVOLVES RELATIONSHIP-BUILDING BETWEEN PRACTITIONERS AND FAMILIES AND ENCOURAGING ACTIVE FAMILY PARTICIPATION IN MAKING DECISIONS RELATED TO THEIR CHILD.





EXAMPLE A PRESCHOOL TEACHER TALKS WITH EACH FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS INVOLVED IN THE CHILD'S CARE, TO GATHER INFORMATION CONCERNING THEIR NEEDS AND PRIORITIES.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE





- UNDERSTAND THAT BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS TAKES TIME. BE PATIENT WITH YOURSELF AND THE FAMILIES YOU SERVE!
- PUT YOURSELF IN THE FAMILY'S SHOES AND TRY TO SEE THINGS FROM THEIR POINT OF VIEW.
- REMEMBER THAT A FAMILY'S PERSONAL AND CULTURAL BELIEFS INFLUENCE HOW THEY RESPOND TO THEIR SITUATION. ACKNOWLEDGE A FAMILY'S UNIQUE BELIEFS AND REMAIN NON-JUDGMENTAL.
- REVIEW WITH THE FAMILY A LIST OF THEIR ACTIONS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO STRENGTHEN CONFIDENCE AND COMPETENCE IN ACHIEVING DESIRED GOALS.
