Funded by the CDC, this community-based participatory research project engages academic (PI: Dr. Elizabeth Miller, Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh) and community based youth serving organizations to test, via a two arm cluster randomized controlled trial, a gender transformative sexual violence and adolescent relationship abuse perpetration prevention program among African American adolescent males ages 14-17.

Through support from the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation, between January 2013 and December 2014, adolescents ages 14-22 participated in mixed methods focus groups to identify barriers and facilitators of adolescent mental health care. We (PI: Dr. Lovie Jackson Foster, University of Pittsburgh's School of Social Work) analyzed this data to assess similarities and disparities between African American and White youth with varying levels of community violence exposure, mental health histories, and access to technology (e.g., cell phones, personal computers).
